Subject: Direct Cash Transfer in Schemes of the Ministry of Minority Affairs

Sir,

I have been directed to draw your attention to roll out of the next phase of DBT for the 26 Schemes of Government of India. You are already aware that the following three Schemes of the Ministry of Minority Affairs have been identified for Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) as under:

1. Post Matric Scholarship Scheme.
2. Merit cum Means based Scholarship Scheme.
3. Maulana Azad National Fellowship.

2. It has been decided that the next phase of DBT roll out will be effective from 1st July 2013. In this phase 78 more Districts will be covered in addition to the 43 Districts already under DBT. The list of 78 Districts is enclosed. The National Population Register under the Offices of Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India has been selected to generate Aadhaar numbers in these Districts. The office of Registrar General of India will be setting up their centers by 15.04.2013 in concerned district at the Tehsil level.

3. It has been already communicated to all States/UTs that the Post Matric Scholarship Scheme for notified minority communities will go online completely. This will ensure capturing of the Bank Account Number of each applicant and therefore help in seeding the same with the Aadhaar Number in no time.

4. The Aadhaar field has also been declared mandatory for the beneficiaries applying under Post Matric, Merit cum Means based Scholarship Schemes and Maulana Azad National Fellowship Scheme. It is therefore requested to get the Aadhaar Cards made for all eligible students under the schemes on priority basis. This will ensure DBT to the eligible beneficiaries.

5. The aim is to move towards an Aadhaar Bridge Payment System (ABPs) and Government of India has targeted for a complete switchover to an Aadhaar enabled payment system through the Aadhaar Bridge Payment by covering 78 more Districts. Therefore, efforts for speeding up Aadhaar enrolment, in collaboration with UIDAI, should be continued. No slackening is expected in this regard.

6. Government of India is also working on Business Process Re- engineering (BPE) to ease in DBT.
7. All efforts and processes would go in vain if we do not have a robust Monitoring and Evaluation System. Besides online monitoring at the Ministry level, this Ministry is constituting a Committee to review UIDAI registration and seeding on fortnightly basis.
8. You may bring this to notice of respective Collectors/ Lead Bank Officers of your Districts and Director, information of your State/UT to initiate/ propagate action to obtain UID number and monitor seeding of Bank Account with Aadhaar Number.
