Subject: Grant in aid under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Multi sectoral Development Programme for minorities to Government of Bihar for the year 2009-10 for Kishanganj District.

Sir,

I am directed to convey the sanction of the President for release of an amount of Rs. 15,84,25,000 (Rupees fifteen crore eighty four lakh twenty five thousand only) as 1st instalment (50% of total central share) of the total sanctioned amount of Rs. 31,68,49,000 (Rupees thirty one crore sixty eight lakhs forty nine thousand only) for the year 2009-10 to the Govt. of Bihar for implementing the scheme "Multi Sectoral Development Programme for minorities" for Kishanganj district as per the details enclosed at Annexure. The non-recurring grant may be released to the Govt. of Bihar through CAS, Reserve Bank of India, Nagpur.

2. The expenditure is debitable to Demand No.66, Ministry of Minority Affairs Major Head- "3601" Grant-in-aid to State Government, 04- Grants for Central Plan Scheme (Sub Major Head), 378 -General- (Welfare of Schedule Casts/Schedule Tribes and Other Backward Classes) -other grants, 04 - Multi sectoral Development Programme for minorities, 04.00.31 - Grant-in-aid for the year 2009-10.

3. Utilization Certificate for this grant should be submitted by the grantee in the prescribed format within 12 months of the date of the Sanction Order.

4. The State Government should ensure that a board containing information of the date of sanction of the project, likely date of completion, estimated cost of the project, source of funding i.e. MsDP (Government of India), contractor(s) name and the physical target is displayed. After completion of projects, a permanent display would be installed.

5. This sanction issues with concurrence of IFD vide their Dy. No. 293/AS & FA (MA) dated 22.06.2009. *It is noted at S.No. 6 in the Grant-in-aid Register.*

(a) Upgradation of Primary Health Centre (PHC):

- The State Government would ensure that the centres located in areas having the highest concentration of minority population would be selected. NRHM construction norms, design, specification and standards would be followed and the State share would be provided. The list of the centres with location would be furnished.
- To prevent duplication, the Government of Bihar should ensure that the centres funded under MsDP were reflected in the State Action Plan.

(b) Indira Awas Yojana (IAY):

- The approval was given on the assurance that the State Government would ensure that the IAY houses would be given to BPL families selected from the approved waiting list, even if they belonged to communities other than the minority communities, strictly in order of their ranking in the list as per the IAY guidelines.
- It should be ensured that not less than 20 units were distributed in a village. The list of the villages indicating the number of houses to be constructed, would be provided. State share would be provided.
- To prevent duplication, the Government of Bihar would ensure that the units funded under MsDP were reflected in the State Action Plan of the scheme and information also sent to the Ministry concerned.

(c) Construction of anganwadi centres:

- The centres would be located in villages which have the highest concentration of minority population.
- The State Government would provide a list of villages where these centres would be constructed.
